Six Ways to Start 2016 on the Right Financial Foot

The Independent Community Bankers of America® (ICBA) and the nation's more than 6,000 community banks encourage consumers to keep their financial goals front and center in 2016. The ICBA and Rushville State Bank offer you six tips on how to manage your finances in 2016:

- 1. **Set up and follow a budget.** Organize household income and monthly bills, and prioritize your family needs and wants. Use online tools, such as budget calculators or PFM software to track expenses against income. The Online Banking product offered by Rushville State Bank allows users to categorize expenses from their checking and savings activity in order to track income and expense. Information can then be downloaded to PFM software for tracking.
- 2. Pay bills on time—every time. Paying on time avoids late fees and protects your credit score. Several options are available through Rushville State Bank to ensure your payments are received on time. 1) Utilize the Bill Payment module through Online Banking or Mobile Banking to pay bills on a scheduled-in-advance date, on a recurring schedule, or have the bill automatically delivered, scheduled, and paid through the system automatically on its due date. 2) Sign up for an automatic withdrawal from your checking account by contacting the biller directly and giving your routing number and account number. 3) Contact the biller directly and pay the bill on a recurring basis using your Rushville State Bank debit card.
- 3. Check your account balances. Keep track of the amount of cash you can withdraw and how many purchases you can make. Avoid having an overdraft and pay attention to fees and charges that can be avoided. Frequently checking your accounts will also help you detect and resolve any unauthorized transactions faster. Maintain an accurate register of your account balance and reconcile your register with your account statement on a regular basis. Utilize Online Banking or Mobile Banking to stay informed about your account balances between statement cycles. Contact Rushville State Bank to establish an automatic transfer of funds between your accounts in the event of an inadvertent overdraft to lessen NSF or Overdraft fees. If you are a debit card holder, sign up for the Shazam Bolt\$ product to stay informed of your "card balance" (items paid for with your debit card that are not yet reflected in your account balance) as well as being notified of possible fraudulent items.
- 4. **Use credit cards wisely.** Know your limits and when you are approaching them. Don't think of credit cards as free money or unlimited funds. *Track your card balances and review your monthly statements to ensure all transactions have been authorized by you. Avoid paying only the minimum payment.*
- 5. Pay yourself with automatic savings. Setting aside a little money every payday is manageable and will help you achieve your financial goals. Contact Rushville State Bank to set up an automatic transfer from your checking account to a Savings account or Individual Retirement Account on a weekly or monthly

basis to save for that special purchase or to establish an emergency fund.

6. **Protect your identity.** Provide your debit card or checking account information selectively and only with companies or websites that you trust. Community Banks will never ask for your information over the phone so do not release this information to callers purporting to represent your Bank.

It's never too late to take control of your finances. The Rushville State Bank staff is available to help customers succeed and thrive in their financial lives.
