
From the **President's Desk**

FRAUD ALERT: Gift Card Scams On The Rise



The way the scam works is as follows: victims receive an unsolicited message from someone stating they are with a customer service department. They may say your

The way the scam works is as follows: victims receive an unsolicited message from someone stating they are with a customer service department. They may say your account is frozen and you need to purchase one or more branded gift cards and provide the claim codes over the phone in order to remove the freeze on your account. Other things they might ask for are your account password, full credit card ID or bank account number.

Companies will never ask you to provide sensitive personal information or purchase gift cards to unlock your account. If you receive such a message, disregard it and contact the Federal Trade Commission at (877) FTC-HELP if you wish to file a complaint. Visit ftc.gov/giftcards to learn more about common gift card scams.
