

Shop Safe! Five tips to help you avoid scams during the holidays.



- **I. Shop where you trust.** Make your purchases from legitimate websites and retailer dedicated apps. Do not shop from random or unsolicited emails and be wary of social media advertisements.
- **2.** Use secure, unique passwords for email accounts, shopping websites and apps. Change passwords often and use complex passwords and additional authentication methods when available to avoid account takeover.
- **3.** Use a single card for all online purchases to minimize risks to only one account. Consider using a prepaid card with only the balance needed to complete your planned purchases.
- **4. Beware of phishing ads and deals** that look too good to be true. Clicking or responding to these may allow malware or viruses to be installed on your device.
- **5. Review your account information regularly.** Watch for and report any suspicious activity. Keep a record of your transactions and compare it to your account activity.
